

1. Last week I exegeted 1Ti 1:9, and when time expired we were about to begin an analysis of 1Ti 1:10.
2. Before we resume that study you may want to use the provisions of 1Jo 1:9 by silently naming your sins to God as the Holy Spirit may or may not show.
3. Now we are ready to continue our analysis of Paul's letter to Timothy, but first an expanded translation of 1Ti 1:8-9.

1Ti 1:8 But we know the Mosaic law is most certainly good, if it is used lawfully,

1Ti 1:9 you have certainly been taught and now know that the Mosaic law was not established for the mature believer but instead it is for those who break the law, for those who are undisciplined and habitually reject authority, for those easily influenced by evil, for those dominated by their old sin natures, and for those who strike or murder their parents, and murderers in general,

4. I want to review some of that learned and then begin new material on page 2.
5. By way of introduction, we learned the law has two extant purposes today. The two are
 - to lead unregenerate man to Christ Gal 3:24
 - and to provide the foundation upon which a nation's laws can be built. 1Ti 1:8-10
6. A nation that builds its laws on the Mosaic law will provide peace and stability for its citizens.
7. It is key we understand that the laws of divine establishment are designed to control antinomians.
8. Let's see what we can learn from the Greek of verse ten.

KJV - Sentence Continues

1Ti 1:10 For whoremongers, for them that defile themselves with mankind, for menstealers, for liars, for perjured persons, and if there be any other thing that is contrary to sound doctrine;

NIV

1Ti 1:10 for adulterers and perverts, for slave traders and liars and perjurers-- and for whatever else is contrary to the sound doctrine;

FOR WHOREMONGERS πορνός

1. **Pornos** is better translated "for fornicators and adulterers ..." or "for the sexually immoral ..."
2. **Pornos** is a noun declined as a dative singular.
3. **Pornos** is often used in scripture to describe "those who indulge in fornication or adultery."

NIV

1Co 5:9 I have written you in my letter not to associate "**with sexually immoral people--**" (KJV fornicators)

1Co 5:10 not at all meaning the people of this world "**who are immoral,**" (KJV fornicators) or the greedy and swindlers, or idolaters. In that case you would have to leave this world.

1Co 5:11 But now I am writing you that you must not associate with anyone who calls himself a brother but is "**sexually immoral**" (KJV a fornicator) or greedy, an idolater or a slanderer, a drunkard or a swindler. With such a man do not even eat.

NIV

1Co 6:7 The very fact that you have lawsuits among you means you have been completely defeated already. Why not rather be wronged? Why not rather be cheated?

1Co 6:8 Instead, you yourselves cheat and do wrong, and you do this to your brothers.

1Co 6:9 Do you not know that the wicked will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the "**sexually immoral**" (KJV fornicators) nor idolaters nor adulterers nor male prostitutes nor homosexual offenders

1Co 6:10 nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God.

1Co 6:11 And that is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

NIV

Eph 5:5 For of this you can be sure: No "**immoral,**" (KJV **whoremonger**) impure or greedy person--such a man is an idolater-- has any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God.

3.1 Webster defines fornication as "sexual intercourse between partners who are not married to each other."

4. The biblical definition of fornication would clearly include adultery. Let me give you several points about adultery.

5. Adultery is technically distinguished from fornication, which is intercourse between unmarried persons. However, the Greek word **Porneia**, uniformly translated "fornication" in the KJV, properly includes all lewdness and sexual irregularity.

6. Adultery is declared a sin in Exo 20:14 and Deu 5:18.

Exo 20:14 "Thou shalt not commit adultery.

Deu 5:18 Neither shalt thou commit adultery.

7. Capital punishment is demanded in the Mosaic law for both adultery and fornication. Lev 20:10 and Deu 22:20-21

Lev 20:10 "If a man commits adultery with another man's wife--with the wife of his neighbor--both the adulterer and the adulteress must be put to death.

Deu 22:20 But if this thing be true, and the tokens of virginity be not found for the damsel:

Deu 22:21 Then they shall bring out the damsel to the door of her father's house, and the men of her city shall stone her with stones that she die: because she hath wrought folly in Israel, to play the whore in her father's house: so shalt thou put evil away from among you.
